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- 1. Children close their eyes while teacher removes one of the story sentences from the board. They open their eyes, then say which one is missing.
- 2. The teacher says the sentence 'I gave her a banana', then shows pictures of e.g. a little girl, a man, a mother and father, a cat, etc. Children have to say the sentence with the correct pronoun for each.
- 3. After reading the story, the teacher chooses different children to act it out.
- 4. The teacher tells the children they are going to travel in a spaceship to another planet. In groups, they make a list of things they want to take with them.
- 5. Each child has a different version of a picture to their partner. Without looking at each other's picture, they take turns to describe what they see in order to find five differences.
- 6. The teacher asks the children a series of questions about an imaginary day out such as, 'Where are you going? Who's with you? What' the weather like?' Children sit quietly with their eyes closed thinking about the answers.
